

Heather Parrino is the coordinator for the Building Resiliency In Campus Community (BRICC) Coalition. BRICC is most well-known for advocating and implementing initiatives including AlcoholEdu/Haven programs, a statewide medical amnesty law and Voice of Reason pilot. BRICC provides leadership in advancing policies and experiences that increase resiliency and reduce high risk drinking.
